



Wedding Couple: True Or False Version #1 “General Knowledge”

In this version, I use general trivia-like wedding facts for the game. This version is better for when you feel like your audience won't necessarily know you SO well that a more specific version about you might be a guessing game at best. It also is a kind of “Done-For-You” version, where I simply use the questions below and game on!

This version requires the least amount of homework. However, it is least the personal to you both (it is still very fun, though!).

Remember, for both versions the offer of prizes, even small things like a few boxes of chocolates or cheap bottles of wine, make this game a lot more appealing (for some reason people like prizes?).

1. Every year, Hawaii, USA is the most popular destination for weddings
 - a. **FALSE. Las Vegas, 100,000 every year (Hawaii 25,000)**
2. The most expensive dress on this earth cost about 16 million AUS dollars
 - a. **TRUE. It was designed by Martin Katz and Renee Strauss and had 150 carats of diamonds.**
3. Egyptian brides are pinched by male guests to wish them luck
 - a. **FALSE. Female guests do!**
4. The Guinness World Record for the largest wedding in a prison is currently held by Carandiru prison in Sao Paolo, Brazil.
 - a. **TRUE. 120 inmates married their fiancés in the year 2000**
5. Queen Victoria's wedding cake weighed a total 300lbs or about 136kgs.
 - a. **TRUE**
6. More than 20% of couples share the wedding planning and do tasks together.
 - a. **FALSE. It's more than 40% now!**

This version is a lot more personal to you as a couple and is generally better for when you have a smaller wedding with an audience who you feel generally know you both well overall. This game basically becomes a “who knows you best” kind of game which, when people get answers wrong, can be hilarious and make for great banter.

This version does require quite a bit of homework from you, however. I have provided several sample questions below as a guide. For me to have enough so I won't typically run out I need at least 25 questions. You're also welcome to come up with your own if you are feeling adventurous!

To make things easier, if you at least provide me with simple questions and answers I will turn them into True or False type ones for you! 😊

Wedding Couple: True Or False Version #3 “Hybrid (Best of Both Worlds)”

This version is my favourite as it is truly the best of both worlds! It is essentially a mash-up of both version 1 and version 2, making it a good mix of general knowledge “off-the-wall” wedding facts and fictions and stuff about you as a couple as well. This adds a level of personalisation without relying on your audience to know a tonne of stuff about you.

This version requires a medium amount of homework from you both. To ensure I have enough questions/answers to last at least 3 rounds (it is possible we could go 4 rounds depending on how “bad” they are at the trivia!) I require you to choose **15 questions from Version #1** and **15 questions from Version #2**. As a reminder, questions from Version #2 need your individual input.

If you’re not sure how to make the prompts above into actual true or false questions, that’s ok! I’m happy to take the fact/fiction you give me and make it into a proper T or F question. Also, if you’re not sure how to go about it and need clarification, don’t hesitate to let me know!
